Sunday Worship

This fall, for our scripture readings in worship, we finish up Year B and the Gospel of Mark. Then, beginning in Advent we start a new Church Year with the Gospel of Luke, in Year C of the 3-year *The Revised Common Lectionary*.

We look forward to hearing God's word in these two great books of the New Testament. Our scripture readings each week take us through God's story, the story of God's salvation. We have come to understand that the Bible, from the earliest pages of Genesis through to the last verse of Revelation, is one epic story. As we hear this story unfold from week to week, we are immersed in the salvation story.

In our hearing the words of scripture, in our prayers and singing, in our coming to the table for Holy Communion, our prayer is always that God would be present with us in our worship, which fact God, in Jesus, has promised to do—"where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am with you also." We know and trust that God is faithful, and keeps promises, and so we are confident that God is indeed present with us.

In fact, God is the one to whom we offer our worship. In our 'mecentered' world, it is easy to fall into the habit of thinking that I am the audience and then I evaluate whether I like the service or not; whether it meets my needs. But the reality is God is the one to whom our worship is directed. The words and actions of worship—prayed and sung—are part of what we all together offer to God. We are all participants in worship, and God is the audience. We come to worship on Sunday mornings to join with others in offering our time, talents, and treasure ... our very lives to God.

We understand the unique circumstances of living in the midst of a pandemic. And so, based on your comfort level, this fall, I invite you make it a priority to join the whole Pilgrim community as together we offer our praise and our lives to God, trusting God hears us, is present with us, and is in turn offering His life to us.

Confirming Faith

Outreach in Our Community

This summer offered many opportunities to connect with our neighbors! We were able to invite our community to VBS, host several children's camps, and provide space for community groups to meet. Girl Scouts has resumed their meetings and held several summer gatherings at Pilgrim. TOPS is back to meeting on Wednesdays, and AA meets regularly twice a week. We have also been able to partner with our community Buy Nothing Group to host a gathering and find new homes for some of our unused items around the church. It is so good to meet our neighbors and create relationships.

A genIteman who attends AA here at Pilgrim recently shared how grateful he was to be able to continue meetings during the pandemic. He shared that he also occasionally uses the parking lot as a sanctuary to reset and "get his mind right" before continuing his day. What a blessing it is to be able to serve our community and meet the needs of our neighbors in ways that are most meaningful to them.

Our feeding ministries at Pilgrim continue, full steam ahead! We received a \$500 grant from ELCA World Hunger, and fundraised an additional \$780 to use for our feeding ministries. We are in the planning phase of using that money to bolster our Firgrove Backpack Program, and help get our Community Garden back into shape. Our faithful volunteers are still providing hot meals to the guests of New Hope Resource Center.
